Where	 Testing will take place at FHS in the gyms and the World Language Annex. Testing room assignments will be posted in the mall areas on Friday 2/26. What to Bring	 Required Items Valid ID (Government-issued or school ID) Approved Calculator (check this list and consult with your math teacher about which type to bring) Pencils and erasers Face covering/mask will be worn for the duration of the exam. BRING YOUR LUNCH- you will eat in your testing room after testing concludes.
	Recommended Items ■ Snack & bottled water (if you want to bring these you may keep them under your desk. Note that water must have a lid.) ■ A watch (without an audible alarm- not a "smart" watch) ■ Extra batteries for your calculator
What NOT to Bring	Prohibited Items ■ Any devices, including digital watches, that can be used to record, transmit, receive, or playback audio, photographic, text, or video content (with the exception of CD players used for Language with

	 Listening Subject Tests only) Audio players/recorders, tablets, laptops, notebooks, Google Glass, or any other personal computing devices iPods or other MP3 players iPads or other tablet devices Laptops, notebooks, PDAs or any other personal computing devices Any texting device Cameras or any other photographic equipment Separate timers of any type Protractors, compasses, rulers Highlighters, colored pens, colored pencils, mechanical pencils Pamphlets or papers of any kind Dictionaries or other books—there are no exceptions, even if English is not your first language
Timing Estimate	 8-8:30 AM- Arrive to your testing room, find your assigned seat, and turn off your cell phone/electronic devices. 8:30 AM- Begin the preadministration section Between 9 and 9:15 AM- Begin the timed portion of the exam Section 1: Reading (65 minutes, then a 10-minute break) Section 2: Writing and Language (35 minutes) Section 3: Math Test- No Calculator (25 minutes, then a 5-minute break) Section 4: Math Test- Calculator (55 minutes) Once the timed section begins, the SAT with breaks is 3 hours and 15 minutes. Plan for the exam to conclude by 12:30 PM. **Update- After testing concludes, students will be released to go to either lunch (4 and 5 Lunch) or to Period 4B.
